

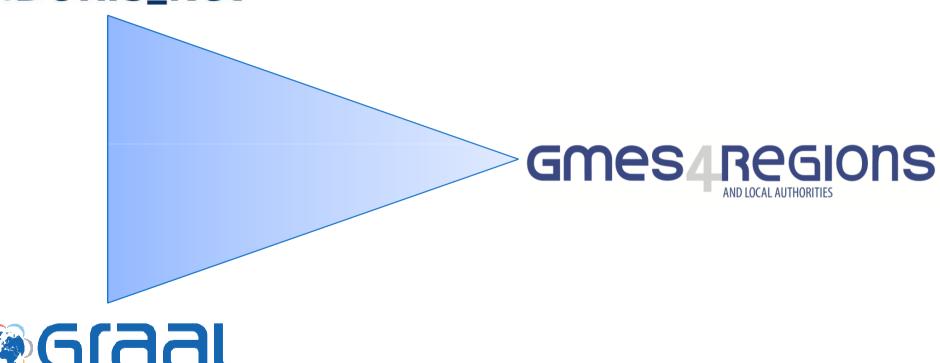

- 2 major european networks (NEREUS Network of European Regions Using Space Technologies - and ERRIN – European Regions for Research and Innovation) gathering more than 120 local or regional authorities

- 2. Increase awareness of GMES among EU regions, cities and provinces

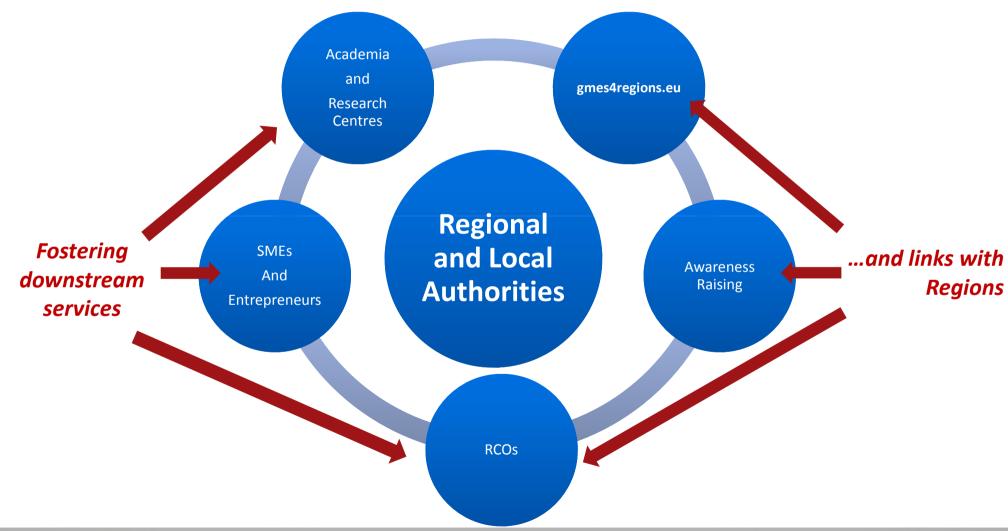








THE PILLARS OF GMES4REGIONS











 The gmes4regions.eu portal intends to be a one-stop-shop for the various (potential) actors, users and service providers of GMES

- It provides tools and information adressing:
 - The demand side (LRAs)
 - The offer side (service providers and entrepreneurs)
 - The development side (Academia and Research Centers)
- Objective: promote the website with LRAs

PILLAR # 2 - AWARENESS RAISING

- Why? LRAs have a very low awareness of GMES
- Key factor: Each LRA is a potential user of GMES services
- The role of G4R:
 - Analysis of LRAs needs
 - Understanding the mechanisms behind the slow uptake of GMES at local level through analysis and interviews with LRAs in several countries
 - Development of a user-oriented taxonomy
 - Window on GMES focused on LRAs

- LRA-focused Taxonomy

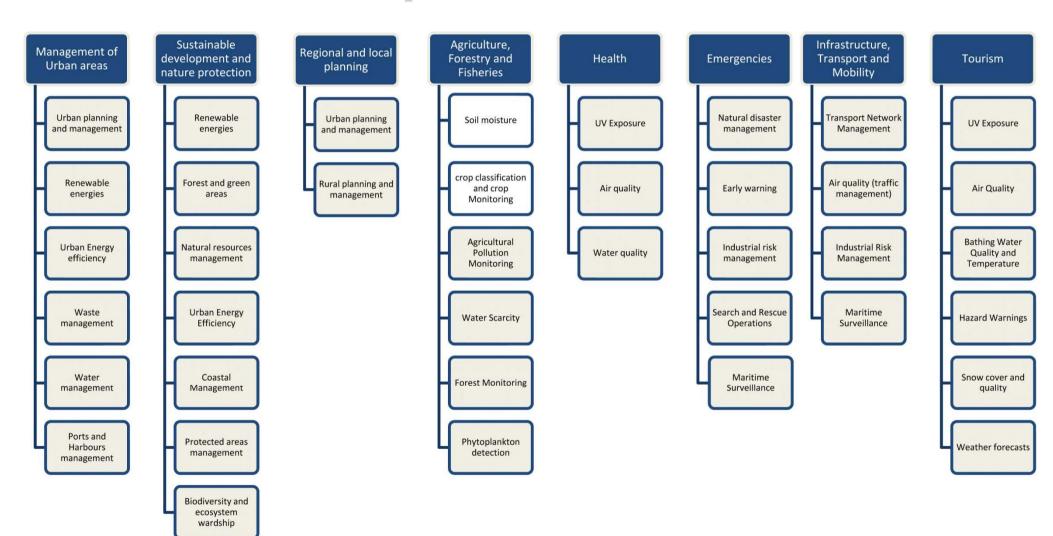






THE USER ORIENTED TAXONOMY

PILLAR # 3 — SMEs AND ENTREPRENEURS

- Why? They develop services, they have a crucial interaction with LRAs (clients), newcomers can bring new ideas
- Key factor: the endogenous dimension of GMES
- The role of G4R:
 - List the various Service Providers in the EU
 - Identify the various (non-technical) barriers to be faced by new entrants
 - Develop a guide on European funding opportunities for SMEs and Entrepreneurs (available on the gmes4regions.eu portal)









PILAR # 4 — ACADEMIA AND RESEARCH CENTRES

- Why? Growth and Jobs will only be fostered by GMES provided there are experts trained to deliver and use the services.
- Key factor: There is a need to bridge the gap between research and the market
- The role of the **Gmes** Academy:
 - List the various Universities and Research Centres working on/teaching GMESrelated issues
 - Foster the exchange of information about on-going GMES-related research activities among the various GMES actors
 - Support the development of a « GMES expertise » among european young and future researchers









PILAR # 5 — AWARENESS RAISING TOOLS

Why? To spread word towards European local and regional authorities

Key factor: Low awareness

- The role of G4R:
 - Help GMES to reach potential end-users
 - Production of communication tools (MultiMedia Presentation, Success Stories and Window on GMES)
 - Events
 - Coordination with other GMES projects









PILLAR # 6 — THE REGIONAL CONTACT OFFICES (1/3)

- RCOs are local centre of GMES expertise
- Six RCOs (Acores PT, Basilicata IT, Bremen DE, East Midlands UK, Lombardia – IT, Midi-Pyrénées / Aquitaine – FR) and nine other regions in process of developing RCOs
- RCOs are at the interface between industry, R&D actors, regional users and policy makers
- RCOs are hosted by independent entities and mandated by its regional authority

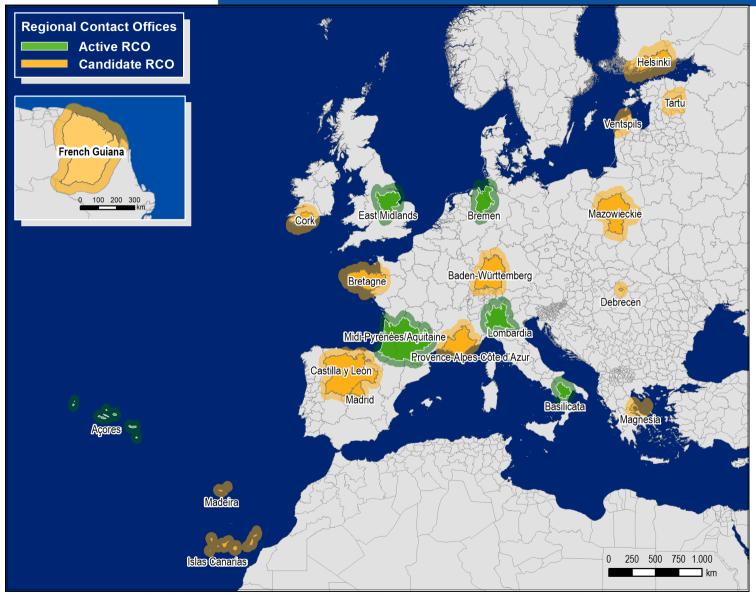
